Creek Minister's Art Exhibition

In a salon of the National Museum of Fine Arts over a hundred members of the Greek community and Argentine art-lovers gathered yesterday in order to witness the presentation of a work of art by the Greek Minister, Mr Kimon Collas.

Also present were Dr Oscar Ivanissevich, Argentine Minister of Education, and Dr Juan Luciano Zocchi, director of the museum, as well as Miss Froso Eithimidi whose plastic of two lawns held a place of honour among a swirling mass of admirers.

She is one of Greece's foremost sculptors, and carries on the tradition of her country's ancient art—ceramics.

Her work is to be found in many of Greece's palaces and municipal buildings as also in numerous private collections. She has studied in Paris and Vienna.

Mr Kimon Collas, in a short speech, declared that he had presented it in the manner of a connoisseur and as a lover of works of art.

The director of the museum replied by expressing his great appreciation, adding that it was especially valued by his museum because of an existent shortage of this class of sculpture.
